



CHILD MALTREATMENT 2022 SUMMARY

This infographic presents key data from <u>Child Maltreatment 2022</u>, the 33rd edition of the annual report on child abuse and neglect produced by the Children's Bureau within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The report is based on data voluntarily submitted by child welfare agencies through the National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS). NCANDS collects case-level data on all children who received a child protective services response in the form of an investigation or an alternative response. The 2022 national data are based on data from all 50 States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia.


